2.65 crore Indian students have Specific Learning Disabilities but most lack necessary support

Specific Learning Disability (SLD) is **frequently overlooked**. Instead, individuals with this disability are oftentimes labeled as "lazy," "problematic," or "dumb," **impacting their self-esteem and preventing them from realising their full potential.**



SLD needs urgent attention!

- Lack of awareness & acceptance that leads to no or late diagnosis
- India currently has 1.2 lakh special educators. The ratio of special educators to students with special needs LD is 1:173, SC of India suggests a 1:5 teacher to student ratio in case of SLD *

'Undiagnosed dyslexia wasn't fun,' says billionaire Richard Branson, shares school report

"Going through school with undiagnosed dyslexia wasn't...fun, but I'm glad I didn't let it squash my big ideas," he wrote. Branson also shared how his teachers had written he was "handicapped by bad memory", "very backwards" and had "below standard performance".

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How it began?

Our journey began in 2003. Dr. Anjali Morris, a paediatrician and founder of AMF, used to visit schools where they had donated computers. She noticed students facing **regular punishment** and inquired about it. The teachers attributed it to **laziness, incomplete work and lack of attention**, this prompted Dr. Morris to investigate further. Through studying notebooks and behavior, she discovered that some students had Specific Learning Disability (SLD), marking the start of her journey.


